I. Call to Order

This meeting was called to order by Mayor Heyward at 6:30 PM.

X. Mayor's Update

- Mayor Heyward shared the progress report from F.A. Johnson Development Group, in relation to the new Town Hall construction. A meeting is scheduled for November 14, 2017 to address several issues. She asked Council that if they had any questions or concerns, they should share them with her so that she can have the questions addressed at the meeting.
- Mayor Heyward announced that the groundbreaking ceremony for the new Town Hall will take place Saturday, November 18, 2017 at 11:00AM. She offered Council the opportunity to participate on the program if interested.
- Mayor Heyward shared a survey for Hollywood Trails at the Sap and the proposed swimming complex. The survey is designed to get feedback from the community about what kinds of activities they would like to see at these sites. She encouraged Council to complete the survey and ask that they share with the community as well. This will help the Town develop the total concept for the area.
- Mayor Heyward talked about community block grants and how the process works. She stated that a lot of non profits as well as towns compete for these funds. She said that the Town has been applying in the home fund which is not as competitive and has been successful in receiving funds for the Holly Grove units.

XI. Comments from Council/Mayor

- Councilmember Sausser announced that the R & R Youth and Community Empowerment Organization will commemorate the life of Dr. King through the 50th year Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr, Commemorative Tribute. Several individuals will be presented with the Dream Keepers Award for their outstanding achievements. She proudly noted Mayor Heyward and Councilmember John Dunmyer, III are both nominated for this award.
- Councilmember Dunmyer, III stated for the record that he made a comment that may have appeared to be offensive in regards to a case that was mentioned in the Planner's Report. He has since spoken with the Planner/Zoning Administrator and apologized and issues have been resolved.
- Mayor Heyward stated for the record that she was disappointed when Council voted last month on the boundary change that would have allowed the Trails at the Sap Park to become part of the Town of Hollywood's jurisdiction. She said she thought it was an indiscretion for us not to consider the long term effect of not having the park in our Town. She mentioned that she did reach out to some members of Council that voted against the change to provide more information and possibly an opportunity to reconsider their vote but may not have been compelling enough or just did not get through that this was something that she felt was a great need for the community. She stated that when attending conferences and meetings, she is often asked what draws people to the community. At the top of the list

are the parks. The opportunity was given to have the park in our Town and we chose not to do so and it was very discerning. She said that hopefully, we can revisit the ordinance again in a year and look at the benefits and advantages of having the park in our Town.
